1. Youth That Use Tobacco	<p>a) What steps do schools take with youth who are caught using tobacco?</p> <p>Members are concerned about students using out of school suspensions as time to increase risky behaviors. What actions do schools take beside suspension? The Tobacco Control Program administered by Substance Awareness is a 10 week program that must be completed when students receive a civil citation or are referred into it. If students do not complete the program it delays or suspends their license to drive.</p> <p>b) Resources for teens to Quit Tobacco Use; how to distribute it?</p> <p>Currently Life Skills teachers are distributing it to classes. Suggestions for other distribution included ball fields, pediatricians, resource officers, movies, skating rink, and bowling alley.</p>	<p>a) A copy of the new School District Code of Student Conduct will be sent to Partners since it outlines in detail what options may be taken for underage tobacco use and for those 18 and over. Come to the next meeting prepared to discuss the consequences that are mandatory versus optional. SAC will report on how many in the tobacco class were suspended.</p> <p>b) Put into a tri-fold or another easy format for distribution. Ashley Penn offered to coordinate with other resource officers in Sebastian to distribute.</p>
